#### Sir Peter Blake Trust

Congratulations to Rhiannon Scott who has been selected to attend this year's Sir Peter Blake Youth EnviroLeaders' Forum. The Sir Peter Blake Trust received over 220 applicants for this event, from which 50 were selected. 30 of the delegates at this years' forum will go on to join the Young Blake Expedition to the Kermadecs. This is a once on a lifetime adventure to one of the most unique and special places on the planet, and will see the students travel on board HMNZS Canterbury to the Kermadecs from 8-19<sup>th</sup> August with a crew of subject experts, scientists, artists, educators, communicators, and leaders. The expedition aims to inspire New Zealanders to understand the global significance of the Kernmedec Islands and to encourage stewardship of the Kernadec Marine reserve and the planet's oceans generally.

Delegates will have the opportunity to snorkel and gain understanding of the marine biodiversity of the Kermadecs, to experience life on Raoul Island and the work of the Department of Conservation there, to explore the Island's dramatic and challenging terrain and learn about its history, flora and fauna. The Kermadec Islands have been identified as one of the very few pristine marine areas left on the planet, and as they are over 9,00km from New Zealand very few kiwis will ever have the chance to visit them.

Well done to Rhiannon, this is a great achievement already - hopefully she can make it through to the next stage!!

#### Variety Bash

Last week we hosted the 2012 version of the **Variety** (**the Kids Charity**) **Bash**, and **Ronald McDonald**. The Variety Bash Convoy stopped off here on their way to Wellington, as part of a North Island rally.

"At the heart of Variety's fundraising efforts is the very unique Variety Bash - a quirky car rally which travels hundreds of kilometres in March each year fundraising for Kiwi kids, distributing grants, entertaining communities and telling the Variety story. It's a mad-cap adventure full of eccentric vehicles, larger-than-life characters and heart-felt philanthropy!

For Variety, the Bash provides an ideal opportunity to raise funds and distribute grants to children in need throughout New Zealand who may be challenged by disability, illness or circumstance.

The Variety Bash is a unique event. The logistical structure is based on a week-long car rally, however the Bash is not a race, and the winners are those that raise the most funds and have the most fun!

A Variety Bash convoy consists of vehicles ranging from classic cars to fire engines and everything in between! Vehicles must be at least 30 years old and each year the convoy travels through a different part of New Zealand passing through main towns and rural communities."

Ronald McDonald was part of this year's Bash, and he performed a show for our Year 1-6 students.

This was a really spectacular interlude. The children enjoyed seeing the wonderful vehicles, and the wacky characters. The people involved were friendly and engaging, and really enjoyed meeting our

young people - there were many comments about their good manners.

Variety donated the School a box of books for the Library, and a number of sports balls. As well all children were given a range of goodies and treats (such as hats, pencils, stickers, sweets).

All in all a memorable and enjoyable experience.

#### Saturday Cricket

The cricket season is now over for the **Taihape Cricket Team**. All in all it has been a very successful and enjoyable season, with the highlight finally putting 3 victories on the board. The next challenge is to replace the matting surface of the cricket block.

At full strength, the bowling was the strongest in the grade.

The fielding this season has been a real highlight, showing dramatic improvement from our involvement in the summer

league the previous year. Committed ground fielding and excellent catching supported the efforts of the bowlers. Nathan Chaney did an excellent job as wicket keeper, while Kerryn Clark and James Morrison tried hard and fielded consistently well, and Arthur Kauika caught well in the slips.

The batting was the achilles heel of the team, although there were a number of standout performances over the season.

Matt Jacobson, Arthur Kauika, Mark Riley, and Nathan Chaney scored half centuries, while Wayne Davies batted consistently without producing that big score.

The challenge over the winter is to recruit a couple of reliable batsmen. Cricket training will recommence in August. Roll on the summer of 2012 - 2013!!
